I recently had a Zoom group party of piano students. As the gathered students ranged in age from 8 to 16, with similar musical experience gaps, I needed an icebreaker game that would work for all. I came up with an improvisational game, based on the music alphabet. The younger students already had home-made flash cards of the music alphabet, so I assigned them all to come up with words using the music alphabet. Then they took turns announcing their word and choosing another student to improvise a short melody beginning with those notes. The beginners improvised with one hand, and did pretty well. My high school student, who already thinks in strange harmonies, used both hands and impressed us all. They even challenged me! It was a fun game, connecting the different levels.
