Ms. Barr is a frequent lecturer, adjudicator and accompanist for festival and high school choruses. Her professional appointments include State President for both the Maine and Massachusetts Music Teachers Associations and Independent Music Teachers Forum Chairperson for Music Teachers National Association. Ms. Barr has developed a series of humorous and engaging lectures in music appreciation entitled, "Joyful Listening!" which she has taught not only in the Boston area, but also at the Avocational Adult Piano Workshop held in Kromeriz, Czech Republic in August, 2002 and 2003. Ms. Barr also originated the "Midsummer Adult Piano Retreat," which began in July 2006, and continues to serve as a faculty member for the workshop every summer at Williams College in the Berkshire region of Massachusetts.
